



NATIONAL PROGRESSION AWARD (NPA) IN MUSICAL THEATRE

This National Progression award is your chance to gain a National Certificate in Musical Theatre provided by the most exciting and forward-thinking institution in Scotland.

This gives students the opportunity to develop skills in the areas of Acting, Singing and Dance - all in the context of Musical Theatre and is the perfect starting point of those considering a future in Musical Theatre. This practical course will equip you with the skills required to enter full time training in the performing arts and further your progress towards a career in musical theatre.

Students will develop technique in all three disciplines, by creating performances which are supported by academic study. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to personalise their pathway, enabling a truly unique training experience, which can only be found at the Theatre College of Scotland.

The course requires a great deal of commitment and runs from February - June. It has a blended learning style balancing self-study, contact learning, rehearsal and performance time.

SPECIFICS OF STUDY

- Acting
- Solo and Group Singing Skills
- Group Dance Performance
- Audition Preparation

All disciplines will be taught by industry leading professionals with many years' experience both in training young performers and performers in the profession.

PROGRESSION

After successful completion of this course candidates will be equipped to move onto HNC/HND Musical Theatre and thereafter; a **BA Hons Degree course of choice**.

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AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

Entry to the HNC Acting and Performance course is by audition only. Applicants are required to prepare:

- One classical monologue from a play Shakespeare, Marlowe or Webster (approx 1-2 minutes length)
 AND
- One monologue from a published play written post-1990 (approx 1-2 minutes length)
- One Song that showcases your range and ability.
 Auditionees should provide a suitable backing track or be prepared to sing acapella








HNC and HND Acting and Performance courses focuses primarily on the practical and theoretical skills of a modern performer through classes and workshops, which include acting, voice, movement, devising theatre, acting for camera, text and performance and methods and practitioners.

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Entry is by audition only, applicants are required to prepare:

- One monologue from a published play written post-1990 (approx 1-2 minutes length)
- One Contemporary Song- composed post-1990
 AND
- One Legit Musical Theatre Song
 Auditionees should provide a suitable backing track or be prepared to sing acapella

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To apply students should register their interest by emailing sqa@theatreschoolofscotland.co.uk.

Students will then receive an application form to complete.

Once the office have received the completed application form they will be in touch to schedule an audition date.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry to our school's SQA courses is subject to audition. Auditions are an opportunity for applicants to demonstrate the passion, motivation and talent that is required to succeed in the industry.

Our department heads will be present on audition day and may invite you to attend a short interview.

The recommended age for NPA Musical Theatre is 14+, for HNC and HND courses it is recommended students be of school leaver age having completed their 4th year at high school.

It would be beneficial if you had some previous experience of either Drama, Dance or Musical Theatre. However, there are no specific entry requirements, but you should have performing skills broadly equivalent of SCQF level 4 to access this award.

FEES & FUNDING

FUNDING YOUR COURSE

Our course attracts government funding and our College is classed as a 'Private Training Provider'.

Students of the Theatre College of Scotland, are eligible to apply for a student loan that will cover most of your course fees. Eligible students will also receive a payment towards your course fees from the Student Awards Agency Scotland.

Many students pay for their course fees via student loans together with a small personal contribution, made payable through part time work or private means and paid monthly.

COURSE FEES

Fees for our college course in 2024/2025 are £8375.00 per year. Fees are paid in the following breakdown:

- Deposit (Upon acceptance) £500.00
- SAAS contribution £1285.00

The balance is paid by the student via Student Loan or Personal means as follows:

- September payment £1210.00
- 8 x Monthly payment (Oct May) £672.50

Most Scottish and European applicants will qualify for **SAAS funding** of £1,285 per year, and will be able to apply for SLC Loans, please visit http://www.saas.gov.uk for more information.

Applicants from England do not qualify for funding through SAAS or SLC.



STATIONS: Theatre School of Scotland sits within five minutes walking distance of Glasgow's two major train stations, Central Station and Glasgow Queen Street. Both stations operate numerous services through Scotland, joining Glasgow to the west and east coasts, as well as the Highlands and further south.

ARGYLE STREET STATION:

Theatre School of Scotland is also located next to Argyle Street Station, which runs below street level. This station provides quick access links from the surrounding Glasgow areas to the city centre.

Theatre School of Scotland is easy to reach by bus with over 60 bus routes passing our doorstep.

We are also located within a ten-minute walk from Glasgow's main bus terminal, Buchanan Bus Station, which links Glasgow to all major Scottish cities and towns.

St. Enoch Subway Station is located right outside, across from the Theatre School of Scotland.

The subway operates services every 5 minutes at peak times, and runs from 6.30am to 11.30pm from Monday to Saturday, and from 10am to 6pm on Sundays.
